
EQUANIMITY

NATURAL TIMELESS

Equanimity is nature-focused, Zen, fluid, and fresh. It announces timeless garments made modern by the materials used. Equanimity refers to mental calmness, composure, and evenness and draws inspiration from the inherent balance found at the beach and the tranquil forms that nature creates over time.

Curved and flowing lines evoke quietness, like the ever-changing movement of the sea and wind. Inspired by the natural formation of coastal lines and shells, they create gentle, natural shapes and surfaces through subtle fabric constructions in weaving and knitting.

Exploration of layering and transparency, like when the water reflects or reveals what is beneath, like shells under shallow water or sunlight filtering through clouds. Color is used in very subtle ways, like shading effects.

FLUIDITY + MOVEMENT

Texture - Flowing - Forming - Layering

Techniques like draping weaves, irregular ribbed knits, and 3D shaping mimic nature's soft undulations and organic forms. These structures focus on fluidity and tactility, integrating lightweight yarns and textures that move gracefully with the body, providing visual and sensory comfort.



Density is manipulated through embossing, repetition of small patterns or textures, and layering of light fabrics. Elements of harmonious sizes, spacing, and ratios promote order and composure.

Garments flow naturally with the body, featuring soft, fluid silhouettes.

Lightweight overlays and delicate textures enhance movement, while structured layering provides depth and complexity, allowing the garments to appear both ethereal and grounded.

SOOTHING

CRAFT AND TECH

This direction speaks of positive energy, active softness, constructions, chosen imperfections, crumpled look blends, chambray colors, and recycled materials for a sometimes poorly finished, frayed look in wise, nuanced colors. Bio-sourced materials and biodegradability are in the spotlight.

A trend that brings technology into the invisibility of science and engineering, working with learning from nature. The fabrics become more 3D with fringes and tassels but remain calm.

Unlined tailoring – sheer layering. Super subtle all-over textures.

A mix of delicate machine-made macrame as details and trims mix with simple fabrics.

UNLINED TAILORING, SHEER LAYERING

Crinkle - Rouche - Gather - Drape

Outdoor tech knitwear with simple details, pleats, and structured ribs or a search for transparency for 3D knitwear suitable for open textures that float over the body and are ideal for draping and layering. Super subtle all-over textures. A mix of delicate machine-made macrame as details and trims are mixed with simple fabrics.






CUTS, DETAILS, AND FINISHINGS, SEAMLESS KNITTING

Curated cotton - Micro-stitches - Compact - Sheer/non-sheer - Highly sophisticated

Superfine macrame details, tatting laces, Devore lace look, trims, prints on textures, fine crochet, and delicate embroidery. Fluidity is emphasized with ruffles and rippled stitches for extra movement, drapes, pleated smoked cotton and merino, fine crochet, and delicate embroidery with a feminine feel. Prints on textures, heat transfer prints, bleach effects, dyeing, and printing techniques that look like different shadows, as if the sun has taken the color away or stained it. Heat transfer cut floats.




REFINED - SOPHISTICATED - EXPERIMENTAL

Micro-pleats - Trims - Short fringing

Open weaves like nettings, transparencies with extra weft motifs, cut floats, emboirdery and incorporation of floral patterns, handcrafted crochet with knits and manipulated tassels, to accentuate liveliness, joy and comfort. Diffused floral and plaid patterns, barely there, degrades.






GEO PATTERNED JACQUARDS - RAISED MICRO TEXTURES - INLAY WEAVE JACQUARDS

Eclectic patterns inspired by geometry and organic forms for city living, easy streetwear, and garden inspiration.

Microstructures within grids and checks protruding areas of raised surfaces.

Small geometric patterns inspired by window structures and horticulturists' greenhouses, the random repetition of low-cost building windows, the geometric gardens of housing estates, and plant walls for a relaxed, unstructured urban fashion where accessories are an important and integral part of the outfit. Very simple geometric embroidery and abstract jungle prints were inspired by the works of Gérard-Titus-Carmel.

RESILIENCE AND UNDERSTATED AESTHETICS Micrographics and structures. Experimentation via graphic pattern repeat/size/form/engineering, yarn and color combination. Minimalist loose or faded stripes. This part reimagines the classic suit through the lens of France's post-World War II Zazou movement. Focusing on male and female interpretations, the modern suit is redefined by blending a workwear influence with contemporary design versatile sensibilities, rounded shapes, functional elements, and micro-graphic detail, echoing Zazou's careful reconstruction philosophy with understated elegance. With an emphasis on soft shapes, the suit adapts to life's changes, reflecting a need for garments that move harmoniously.







ANTICIPATION

TROPICAL EXPECTATION

We are entering the height of summer, with an energetic focus on bright colors for joyful opulence.

The intense colors remind us of heat waves. Embossed aspects, brilliance, and iridescence play with vibrant colors and fabricated combinations, sometimes unexpected.

Juxtapositions and superpositions for daywear, vibrancy for a study of light inspired by tropical influences with off-white and deep black enabling contrasting graphic and psychedelic patterns and new color-blocking, or a play where transparencies and superpositions dominate.


Reds are in the spotlight, tamed by their contrasting opposites. The weight of color is shown in building color saturation and pattern density effects to blur visual realities in the layering of fabrics, translucent, crips, bleeding graphic, ikat, semisheer stripes, and ombre tones.

SUPERPOSITION - LAYERING - ASYMMETRY

Inspired by architectural designs and a dynamic interaction between form and function. Diffused color block and overlapping linear patterns

Vibrant earth tones and asymmetrical layers create a protective but feminine barrier.

Space exploration, ultra-light nylons, and innovative textiles for inspiration. Graphic inspiration, transparency, layering, body mapping, ribs, vibrant blocks. Extended lengths, sewn, combined to suggest various ways of mixing parts of garments, such as asymmetric hemlines.

Layered textures or fabrics create depth and duality in function, where the same piece can be worn or styled in different ways, revealing different looks based on how it is draped or adjusted. Patterns that shift or transform visually depending on how the garment is worn, such as a reversible knit.

ANTICIPATION




STUDY OF LIGHT - GRAPHIC INSPIRATION

Mixing warm and cold colors and their interaction mimics how light shifts throughout the day - graphic inspiration.

Diffused block colors evoke the interplay between sun and shadow, creating depth and contrast-soft, blended, gradual color transitions. Overlapping linear patterns evoke protective architecture and structural layering in translucent materials that mimic the weightlessness of space-inspired textiles. The prints are pleated and superimposed to create a false transparency, a pointillist look, and an impression of movement.

More figuratively, we can also study the evolution of Caribbean culture and the madras in lighter weight and sun-drenched tones. Synthetic yarns increase visual color density and achieve high shine and a wet-glazed look.

Retro style and sports aspects for a sexy trend that pays tribute to the body. A dynamic trend for circular knits inspired by sports. Bodysuits, swimsuits, shorts, leggings, and jumpsuits are becoming integral parts of the daily wardrobe, worn with sportswear, hooded jackets, or loose


SPORT - ART - DISTRACTION - URBAN LIFE


